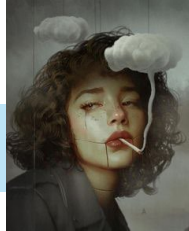
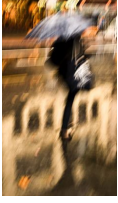
Final submission of all work once exam is completed and teachers to start the marking and moderation process.

Creation of final outcome in exam conditions. Usually spans over a week and exams take place over March and first week in April.

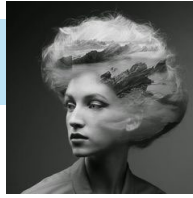
Prep deadline- End of February/ beginning of March. Teacher will set exact date. This deadline covers AO1, AO2 and AO3.

Minimum of 200 photographs in response to chosen photographer and theme. Final refinement to be edited in 10hr period.

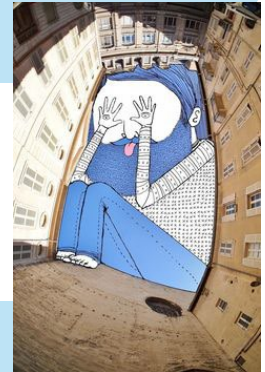
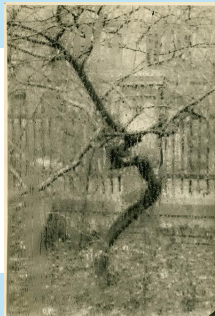
AO3
This assessment objective runs through all aspects of the course and each assessment objective. It is about the quality of your visual and written recording including own recorded photographs and plans of shoots.



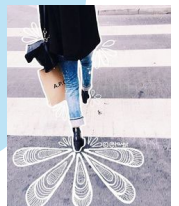
Shoot 2
Minimum of 200 photographs in response to chosen photographer and theme. Refinement from shoot 1.

Shoot 3
Minimum of 200 photographs in response to chosen photographer and theme. Refinement from shoot 2.

AO2
Exploring and developing own ideas in relation to starting point and inspired by chosen photographer. Exploring techniques both visually and through supporting written analysis.



Shoot 1
Minimum of 200 photographs in response to chosen photographer and theme.



AO1
Research into chosen photographer/ question and starting point/theme. Visual responses to the style of chosen photographer and techniques used.
